Media Coverage

2016-2017 Highlights

Our research received over **255** media mentions in local, national and international media including CBC News, The Globe and Mail, Global News, The Guardian, Time Magazine, The New York Times, New York Magazine, NPR, and The Washington Post.

Popular Stories in the News

Research by **Dr. Frances Chen** and former PhD student **Ashley Whillans** found that new university students believe their peers have more friends than they do— and this impacts their happiness.

Research by PhD student **Alessandra DiGiacomo**, and co-authors **Dr. Alan Kingstone** and **Dr. Jiaying Zhao** shows making bins more convenient boosts recycling and composting rates.

Research by postdoctoral research fellow **Dr. Eve Limbrick-Oldfield** and **Dr. Luke Clark** found that after looking at images of slot machines, problem gamblers experience increased activity in the same part of the brain that drug addicts have for cravings. A study by MA student **Anthea Pun** and co-authors **Dr. Andrew Baron** and **Dr. Kiley Hamlin** shows that by the age of one, infants already prefer speakers of their native tongue, but do not necessarily view speakers of an unfamiliar language negatively.

In her book *Take Pride*, **Dr. Jessica Tracy** reveals how pride has shaped our minds and our culture.
